LIFE 2014-2020 — OBJECTIVES

- Contributing towards a resource-efficient, low-carbon and climate-resilient economy; protecting and improving the environment; maintaining and improving biodiversity, ecosystems and, in particular, the Natura 2000 network
- Improving the development, implementation and enforcement of Union environmental and climate policy and legislation
- Integrating and mainstreaming of environmental and climate objectives into other Union policies
- Improving environmental and climate governance
- ❖ Implementing the 7th Environment Action Programme

 - Climate action









LIFE 2014-2020: PRIORITY AREAS & BUDGET





LIFE 2018-2020 MAWP- REMAINING BUDGET

- ❖ Remaining allocation for MAWP2: €1.66 billion
 - **❖ €1,24** billion for ENV Sub-programme (mean: €413 million/year)
 - **♦•** €0,41 billion for CLIMA Sub-programme (mean: €137 million/year)

LIFE 2014-2020 — GEOGRAPHICAL COVERAGE

PRINCIPLE:

Applicable where the Treaty on European Union applies

PARTICIPATION:

- Certain Third Countries may participate on the basis of and in line with the conditions of a cooperation agreement
- Cooperation with International Organisations is possible when necessary to reach LIFE objectives





ACTIVITIES OUTSIDE OF THE EU

May be included if:

- Necessary to achieve Union environmental or climate objectives
- Necessary to ensure the effectiveness of interventions carried out in the Member States' territories to which the Treaties apply
- The Coordinating Beneficiary is established in the EU






LIFE - GENERAL FEATURES

- ❖ Applicants Companies, research institutes, NGOs, public administrations active in the field of environment and climate protection; all legal persons registered in the EU
- Emphasis on replicability/transferability, long-term sustainability, and an EU added value of the project results
- ♦ Not focused on research (♦ H2020)
- ❖ No large infrastructure; not focused on rural or regional development (⇔ agricultural, structural funds)
- Support and monitoring: from Contracting Authority (EASME or European Commission) and external monitoring team





WHO DOES WHAT IN LIFE?





LIFE GENERAL FEATURES

- Funding types: Action grants, Operating grants, Innovative financial instruments (NCFF, PF4EE)
- Project types: traditional, integrated, technical assistance, capacity building, preparatory projects
- Project topics: only for traditional projects under the sub-programme for environment
- Work areas: only for traditional projects under the sub-programme for climate action





LIFE GENERAL FEATURES

- Funding rate: in general, 55% of eligible costs in the MAWP 2018-2020;
- Actors: EASME for all grants except preparatory projects, and; EIB/intermediary banks for financial instruments; intervention of NCPs only if desired
- ❖ National allocations: do not apply in MAWP 2018-2020.





WHAT IS A TRADITIONAL PROJECT?

- **For whom?** Enterprises, associations, public administrations
- Flexibility on the size of the consortium and budget
- Co-funding rate: 55% (ENV-RE & CA) 60% (NAT/BIO);
 - In case of NAT projects that devote more than 50% of their budget for concrete conservation actions to activities benefiting priority habitats or species: 75%
- Types of projects
 - ❖ Pilot (1)
 - Demonstration (2)
 - Good Practice (3)
 - Information/governance (4)

LIFE MAWP 2018-2020

- As in MAWP1, strong emphasis on:
 - Long term sustainability of the project: continuation, replication and transfer
 - EU added value
 - Indicators
- New priority topics and evaluation criteria
- Consider findings of the Mid-Term evaluation:
 - Simplification of the application & reporting processes
 - Replication of project results
 - Improving the communication strategy

RATIONALE FOR THE 2 STAGE APPLICATION

- Simplification of the application process and evaluation of LIFE traditional projects
- Easier procedure & faster feedback
- Need to address the decreasing number of applications for LIFE co-financing in recent years





WHAT IS LIFE 2 STAGE APPLICATION APPROACH?

New simplified two-stage approach







- Only for Environment sub-programme
- Only for traditional projects





Be aware – at the evaluation stage the concept note must fulfil the same elibility criteria than those of the full proposal





The concept note can be modified, validated and (re)submitted as many times as needed until 17/06/2019, 16:00 Brussels local time, for ENV/RE and 19/06/2019, 16:00 Brussels local time, for NAT/BIO and GIE.

Each subsequent submission overwrites the previously submitted version (earlier versions are not archived and are therefore not available anymore).


